

Imperfect Tense Passive (-ba/-ēba)

Repetitive, continuous, customary or habitual action in the past

was/were BEING verbed

used to BE verbed, kept on BEING verbed

1st Conjugation

amabar	<i>I was BEING loved</i>	amabāmur	<i>we used to BE loved</i>
amabāris	<i>you used to BE loved</i>	amabāminī	<i>y'all were BEING loved</i>
amābātur	<i>he was BEING loved</i>	amabantur	<i>they were BEING loved</i>

2nd Conjugation

tenēbar	<i>I was BEING held</i>	tenēbāmur	<i>we were BEING held</i>
tenēbāris	<i>you used to BE held</i>	tenēbāminī	<i>y'all used to BE held</i>
tenēbātur	<i>she was BEING held</i>	tenēbantur	<i>they were BEING held</i>

3rd Conjugation

ponēbar	<i>I was BEING put</i>	ponēbāmur	<i>we were BEING set</i>
ponēbāris	<i>you used to BE placed</i>	ponēbāminī	<i>y'all used to BE placed</i>
ponēbātur	<i>she was BEING set</i>	ponēbantur	<i>they were BEING set</i>

3rd Conjugation (-io)

aspiciēbar	<i>I was BEING looked at</i>	aspiciēbāmur	<i>we were BEING looked at</i>
aspiciēbāris	<i>you were BEING noticed</i>	aspiciēbāminī	<i>y'all were BEING noticed</i>
aspiciēbātur	<i>she used to BE looked at</i>	aspiciēbantur	<i>they used to BE looked at</i>

4th Conjugation

audiēbar	<i>I used to BE heard</i>	audiēbāmur	<i>we were BEING heard</i>
audiēbāris	<i>you used to BE heard</i>	audiēbāminī	<i>y'all were BEING heard</i>
audiēbātur	<i>she was BEING heard</i>	audiēbantur	<i>they were BEING heard</i>
