TRANSLATION RUBRIC

1. *Olim Pygmalion* – Once/long ago/once upon a time Pygmalion
2. *peritissimus artis* – very/most skilled in/of art
3. *Cypri habitabat* – lived/dwelled (was living/dwelling) in Cyprus; inhabited (was inhabiting) Cyprus
4. *Pulcherrimam statuam creavit* – created/made a very/most beautiful statue
5. *et saepe credebat* – and often he believed/trusted/supposed (was believing, etc.)
6. *artem suam puellam esse* – (that) his art was a girl, his art to be a girl; (that) art was his girl, art to be his girl.
7. *Pygmalioni placebat* – it was pleasing to Pygmalion / Pygmalion liked
8. *eam vestibus ornare* – to decorate/dress/furnish/adorn her/it with clothes
9. *et dona ei dare* – and to give her/it gifts
10. *In templo deae* – In a/the temple of a/the goddess
11. *Pygmalion precatus est* – Pygmalion prayed/begged/wished
12. *volo invenire uxorem* – I want to find a wife
13. *similem meae statuae* – similar to my statue
14. *Propter flammam crescentes* – Because of/due to the growing/increasing flames
15. *Pygmalion putabat* – Pygmalion thought/was thinking
16. *deam auxilium laturam esse* – (that) the goddess would/was going to bring/provide help; the goddess to be about to/to be going to bring help
17. *sibi* – to him/for him (N.B. must refer to Pygmalion, not the goddess)
18. *Postquam Pygmalion domum rediit* – After Pygmalion returned (to) home
19. *statua eius* – his statue / the statue of him (N.B. must be the subject of *visa est*)
20. *non dura visa est* – did not seem hard / was not seen (as/to be) hard
21. *Pygmalion gratias maximas egit* – Pygmalion gave the greatest / very great thanks
22. *deae* – to the goddess
23. *statua mutata est* – the/his statue was (has been) changed/turned/shifted/altered
24. *a dea* – by the goddess
25. *in uxorem* – into a/his/the wife
