[Ariadne Helps Theseus]

Haec est fabula dē puellā Ariadnā. Ariadna in insulā Crētā habitābat. Quoque in insulā habitābat Minotaurus. Necesse erat Athēniēnsibus multōs puerōs puellāsque ad insulam mittere. Thēseus cum illis pueris puellisque veniēbat, et amīcōs ā Minotaurō liberāre cupiēbat.

Simulac Ariadna Thēseum vidit, puerum salūtābat: “Ego sciō dē Minotaurō et labyrinthō. Cupiō relinquere patrem et patriam. Sī ego tibi auxilium dabō, poterōne tēcum fugere?”

Puellae respondit, “Ita vero. Poteris in nave meā nāvigāre. Quōmodō possum Minotaurum necāre?” Ariadna Thēseō duo dōna, filum et gladium, dedit. Ubi Thēseus Minotaurum gladiō necāvit, filum eum ē labyrinthō tandem dūcēbat. Thēseus grātiās Ariadnae agēbat, et puellam ab insulā Crētā dūxit.
