

Latin Sentence Patterns Capitulum Sextum

1. Subject + predicate nominative/adjective + est/sunt

Nīlus fluvius est. (Text pg. 2, Line 19) The Nile is a river.

lūlius vir (Romānus) est. (Text pg. 10, Ln. 1) lūlius is a (Roman) man.

Sicilia insula magna est. (Pg. 2 Ln. 30) Sicily is a large island.

2. Subject + intransitive action verb

lūlia cantat. Aemilia venit. Pater dormit. (Pg.21 Ln.5, pg.23 Ln.24, Pg.24 Ln.53)

lūlia sings. Aemilia comes. Father sleeps.

3. Subject + D.O. + transitive action verb

Marcus lūliam pulsat. (Pg.21 Ln. 10,13)

Marcus hits/is hitting lulia.

4. Nom + (a/ab) + ABL meaning "by" + Passive Verb(tur/ntur)

lulius a servīs portatur. (pg.60 ln.70)

Sacci a servīs portantur. (pg.60 ln.73)

Is (Cornelius) equō vehitur. (pg.61 ln.78)
