

## What is a Parent Quiz?

- A Parent Quiz tests the student's knowledge of all vocabulary and objectives from a particular section or sections of Lingua Latina.
- A Parent Quiz is scheduled after each section of Latin has been read and translated in context.
- A Parent Quiz prepares students for the weekly in-class vocabulary quizzes.
- Poor scores on Parent Quizzes indicate the need for *additional, more focused, repetitive* study of Vocabulary and Objectives.

What are the types of Parent Quizzes?

- **Oral** – Parents ask the student to answer verbally with *Latin to English* or *English to Latin*.
  - i.e. – Parent, “What is the Latin word for *also*?” Student answers, “*quoque*”.
  - i.e. – Parent, “How do you say *Rome*, in Latin?” Student answers, “*Roma*”.
    - Spelling counts in Latin, so students must learn how to spell Latin words correctly.
- **Written** – Student fills in the meaning on a sheet of notebook paper, composition book, or copy.
  - Copy Blank Vocabulary/Objectives list from Student Workbook before reading each section to use as the Parent Quiz.
  - Write all Vocabulary words on a sheet of paper in a composition book and have students take the quiz repeatedly, folding the paper each time.
  - Use Clear job ticket with dry erase markers as a parent quiz
  - Composition book – Latin words are written along the left side/column of the page
    - 1st time – Students write the English meaning on the right side
    - 2nd time – Students fold the paper and re-write the English meaning
    - 3rd time + – Students repeat this process until all answers are correct!
- **Quizlet** – Student completes the quiz online or from a printout from Quizlet. Go to the desired Vocabulary section, select **Test**, then on the bottom left select **Options**, then highlight only **Written**, choose whether the student answers with **Latin** or **English**, then select **Create new Test**. You may print, save as PDF, or many other options.

Caution: Quizlet cannot test for knowledge of all objectives!!!
